Leo Yassenoff left his mark all around Columbus

The name of Leo Yassenoff is associated today with the Jewish Community Center on the east side of Columbus. But many charitable associations count him among their benefactors.

Yassenoff was born in Piqua and educated in Dayton. He attended The Ohio State University where he earned a degree in journalism. While working in newspapers he realized it was the advertising people who made what he considered the real money.

He admits he learned the construction business on his own time and made a name for himself in that area. He built several theaters in Columbus, most noticeably the early drive-in theaters on West Broad Street, South High Street and 17th Avenue. His University Theater was dedicated to Ohio State football legend Chic Harley.

Yassenoff's love of football came naturally. He and his brother Solomon played for the Buckeyes in the early 1910s. In 1914, with both brothers on the team, the Buckeyes finished 5-2 overall, 2-2 in the Western Conference. The next year, with only Leo on the team, the Buckeyes finished 5-1-1 overall, 2-1-1 in the league.

He remained a Buckeye fan throughout his life. One story is that he loved to get into the locker room. At one game, Ohio State was trailing at halftime and Coach Woody Hayes was so agitated he couldn't talk. Yassenoff is said to have delivered the halftime pep talk. Ohio State went out in the second half and won the game.

He was also known to have help the players with clothing and jobs – before restrictions were put in place. Friends often said Leo never lost sight of people. His holiday card list often numbered up to 300 people. He was known as a wealthy man who hobnobbed with the ordinary person. One of his favorite charities was Charity Newsies where newspapers are sold to raise money for clothing for children.

He was also an avid reader of newspapers. He often would read stories of the good that people did and send the person a letter of congratulations. Sometimes there would be a check with that letter.

By the time of his death he had accumulated several awards and citations for meritorious service to the community as well as a lot of money. He built an Orthodox synagogue in Columbus, the Agudas Achim Synagogue. He also built the Hillel House at Ohio State, and the Jewish Community Center that changed its name after his death to honor him. A considerable portion of his assets went to a charitable foundation.

He was born Oct. 15, 1893, and died in his Bexley home Aug. 30, 1971. He is buried in Section 91, Lot 53 at Green Lawn.

These photos show a sampling of the damage incurred with that storm.


Thanks to the many volunteers who came out and helped clear away the debris. Your work is greatly appreciated.

The name on the marker is Galloway and can be found on the north part of the upper area of Section C. Sam Galloway served in the U.S.House with Abraham Lincoln and was an Ohio Secretary of State. Even though he lived in what we know today as downtown Columbus, he owned 200 acres of land in far western Franklin County. The community of Galloway bears his name.
