### The Legacy Outlives the Man

The legacy that John Jacob Lentz left the city of Columbus is far more known than the gentleman himself.

Lentz grew up in Belmont County in eastern Ohio and taught school for a few years before attending National Normal University in Lebanon in southwestern Ohio. He also attended Wooster, the University of Michigan, and Columbia University where he obtained his law degree.

Returning to his native Ohio, he was admitted to the bar in Columbus in October 1883. He was a Democrat and elected to two terms as a U.S. Representative—from 1897 to 1901—and was a delegate to the Democratic National Convention in 1908.

In 1894 he founded his legacy—the American Insurance Union and served as its president until his death in 1931.

But Lentz had a vision—that of erecting an exquisite building for his insurance company. It was destined to be the tallest building in the Midwest, six inches taller than the Washington Monument. Caissons, similar to what were constructed to anchor the Brooklyn Bridge in New York, went down to bedrock to build a solid foundation.

This building, called the American Union Insurance Citadel for its strong and enduring qualities, has two levels—a 19-floor portion on the east side, and a 46-floor tower section on the west side.

The building opened Sept. 20, 1927, but the ravages of The Depression in the next decade sent the insurance company into bankruptcy.

The Art Deco style building was purchased by John Lincoln and Leslie LeVeque and became known as the Lincoln-LeVeque Tower. LeVeque, known for the design of the automatic pinsetter in bowling, was killed in a plane crash in 1947. His son Frederick later purchased the building, but he, too, was killed in a plane crash in 1975.

The building held the distinction of the tallest building in the city until the Rhodes Office Tower was erected in 1974. It is currently undergoing an extensive renovation.

Lentz is buried in Section 64, Lot 73, here at Green Lawn. Leslie LeVeque is in the Huntington Chapel.

### Architect Remembered

Nathan Kelley, the architect who oversaw the completion of the Ohio Statehouse, now has a marker. His grave in Section I at Green Lawn had been unmarked since his death in 1871. During the renovations of the Statehouse some 15 years ago, a slab of limestone was found. It was turned into marker for this remark-Ohioan. This marker can easily be seen from the yellow line on a drive through the cemetery.

## Little Garden Club Update: Honeysuckle Removed; Oaks and Shrubs Planted

This past fall Ahlum & Arbor crews selectively removed invasive honeysuckle from around the pond and along both approaches to the historic bridge in the central-western part of the Cemetery. As you can see from the photos, that removal opened up wonderful vistas and accentuated the beauty of both of these natural areas.

Immediately following, David Voyles and Wild Flower Farm crews planted 200 native shrubs to replace the honeysuckle, and planted 14 lovely native Ohio oak trees to honor the founders of the Little Garden Club of Columbus, through whose generosity and partnership these renovations were made possible.

We are so eager to see the new shrubs come out of their winter dormancy this year and to watch them mature along with the native oaks in the future! We invite all of our readers to come out this spring to walk, enjoy the birding and check out our "new additions" surrounding the pond and bridge.
